

JACK'S CAMP

Makgadikgadi Salt Pans - Kalahari Desert

Legendary Jack's Camp (named after its founder) is currently undergoing a re-build and re-opening in May 2020. The new property will pay homage to the enduring and much-loved 1940's campaign style and feature 10 spacious guest tents equipped with indoor and outdoor showers and private plunge pools. The camp will still boast the iconic mess tent, with library and antique pool table, Persian tea tent and tented pool.

SAN CAMP

Makgadikgadi Salt Pans - Kalahari Desert

The 7 impossibly romantic white canvas guest tents of San Camp are furnished with four-poster beds and Persian rugs. A tidy central mess area, a yoga and pool pavilion share the same vintage-chic ambience. All nestle beneath swaying palms amid the endless white salt pans of the Makgadikgadi. Things to do at this seasonal property include cultural walks with Bushmen, game drives and meerkat interactions.



CAMP KALAHARI

Makgadikgadi Salt Pans - Kalahari Desert

The laid-back and more modern sister of San and Jack's, Camp Kalahari sits at the edge of the otherworldly Makgadikgadi Salt Pans. Accommodation is in 12 walk-in ensuite tents, elevated on timber platforms. Ideal for families, this relaxed property offers Bushman walks, game drives by day and by night as well as encounters with semi-habituated meerkats, who sometimes use unsuspecting guests as a perch!



KALAHARI PLAINS

Central Kalahari

This delightful eco-camp offers 8 comfortable suites under canvas, all fitted with a rooftop sleepout area so guests can soak up the sublime desert night skies. The central area is an inviting oasis, with a shaded lounge and dining area, as well as a swimming pool and deck. Learn ancient survival secrets from local Bushmen or seek out the majestic Kalahari black-maned lion and cheetahs on game drives in Botswana's largest conservation area.



MENO A KWENA

Boteti River

Located on tribal lands overlooking the seasonal Boteti River is Meno a Kwena. This cliff-top gem boasts 10 lovely guest tents looking out onto the river, a favourite haunt of local elephants. From May-Nov, Africa's second-largest zebra migration passes by. Bushman cultural walks, game drives into Makgadikgadi and Nxai Pans national parks and sleepouts are all possible at this storied camp, which also has a floating hide for hippo-watching.
