





CONSERVATION UPDATE

50 YEARS OF TIGERS

This year marks 50 years since Project Tiger - the wide scale operation to save India's iconic Bengal Tiger from extinction - was launched in 1973. The most recent "All Tiger Census" highlighted that tiger numbers are up to just under 3000 individuals, and numbers have remained steady in the last few years. This has come about largely thanks to tourism and the outstanding job done by park officials and rangers every single day. The flow on effect is an increase in rural education and greater job opportunities for locals.

VICTORIA FALLS ANTI-POACHING UNIT (VFAPU)

As many of our clients would know, African Wildlife Safaris have been supporting the Victoria Falls Anti-Poaching Unit (VFAPU) in Zimbabwe since its inception in 1999. In the second half of 2022 we were able to donate, together with our clients, USD \$1,643.62 to help continue in their conservation fight.

These rangers put their lives on the line to protect precious wildlife and fragile ecosystems. Their continual efforts have been even more imperative during the last two years, with limited travellers to help support this non-for-profit organisation.

VFAPU WILDLIFE CONSERVATION EXPERIENCE


In November 2022, our General Manager Anne-Marie Zambelli and some of our clients joined the VFAPU rangers on a behind-the-scenes tour in Zimbabwe's Zambezi National Park. This activity includes a presentation on the history of the unit and the challenges they face, before heading out into the park to help rangers record game sightings, identify spoor, sweep for wire snares and visit areas to investigate for any signs of poaching. The experience helps to provide more eyes on the ground to deter various forms of poaching, whilst guests get to play an important role in conservation.

With another privately guided Zambian safari coming up in August we have to admit that this is one of our favourite places in Africa. Having travelled this continent for 40 years we strive to find areas where an authentic wildlife

safari is still possible – unfenced, wild and without the crowds.

The beautiful South Luangwa Valley is true African bush, criss-crossed by seasonal streams and rivers which are a haven for wildlife – lions, leopards, hippos, elephants and numerous types of antelope. The safari camps we choose are small and intimate, with a maximum of 10 guests, and far from tourist areas. In the dry season the receding waters attract large numbers of game, whilst crocs sunbake open-jawed on the sand banks, and hippos jostle for territory in the shallow pools. Safe, shallow pools are also perfect for cooling off with sundowner drinks, as we watch vibrant sunsets and the day fading from orange to purple.

The Lower Zambezi National Park is an absolutely stunning area on the northern shore of the mighty Zambezi River. The river is a paradise for birds, huge pods of hippo, countless crocodiles lazing on

sandy islands, and a lifeline for elephants, buffalo and other large mammals. Even endangered wild dog flourish here, with two large packs successfully hunting big game like waterbuck and buffalo. Our favourite safari camp – beautiful Potato Bush – has a stunning position at the edge of the river and close to the Chifungulu Channel, the best river channel for canoeing trips.

Our next safari departing on 23 August this year visits both these superb wildlife areas. We stay in small, very comfortable lodges and bush camps which are surrounded by true wilderness, overlooking rivers or floodplains. Accompanied by excellent local guides we will enjoy game drives, walks and canoe excursions, and learn more than any book on natural history can teach you.




QUEST FOR THE SNOW LEOPARD & LAND OF THE TIGERS

Join us in February 2024 on this once in a lifetime adventure as we head to Ladakh, India, on a quest to find the elusive snow leopard. This fabled “ghost of the Himalayas” is more closely related to the tiger than the leopard, and today there are less than a hundred of these beautiful creatures left in Ladakh. This escorted group expedition promises to be one of those life-changing, extraordinary experiences, as we venture into the rarefied, winter world of Trans-Himalayan landscapes, exotic wildlife, remote mountain villages and age-old cultures.

If you are up for the adventure, this is a unique journey into high altitude regions in search of rare wildlife like snow leopards as well as wolves, ibex, red foxes, urial (mountain sheep) and many species of birds. Then returning to lower altitudes further south we will visit renowned Bandhavgarh National Park for a tiger safari. In between there will be time to explore the ancient monasteries and palaces of Leh, and the famous temples of Khajuraho.

No mountaineering experience is required for the snow leopard quest, but you will need to be a reasonable hiker and in good health. You will be heading to 4000 metres. Our expedition will be accompanied by expert trackers and a support team of chefs, porters and guides. Much of the time we will travel by vehicle, but we will also explore on foot, hiking into three valleys with our exceptional trackers and spotters.

Accommodation will be in a comfortable lodge which is partly owned by local villagers. The lodge has heating, ensuite rooms, and hearty meals prepared by the expedition staff. Our expedition will benefit the entire village bringing much needed funds in the cold winter season. At one time snow leopards were perceived as a threat to livestock, but today the villagers see the benefits of conserving leopards and their habitat.



THE PEARL OF AFRICA

Many countries offer travellers abundant reasons to visit – great food, friendly locals, beautiful scenery and unique experiences. Yet some destinations stand out, with moments that promise to change you in ways that words can't explain. Uganda is one such jewel; aptly known as the 'Pearl of Africa'.

Part of its charm is the raw, authentic African experience one still finds here. Yes, there are upmarket lodges and Wi-Fi is widely available, yet there is still a sense that you are encountering cultures that are unfamiliar. Its serenity and remoteness draw one in, enhanced by rare encounters not widely found elsewhere.

Uganda boasts an outstanding ecological diversity. This is primate paradise. Trekking endangered mountain gorillas in the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, chimpanzees in Kibale Forest and golden monkeys in Mgahinga National Park are thrilling experiences. Observing a family of gorillas in their natural habitat feels both surreal and humbling. The Queen Elizabeth National Park where tree climbing lions dangle lazily in shady fig trees is perfect for classic game viewing safaris. Indulge in scrumptious bush breakfasts and spectacular sundowners.

It is imperative to conserve Uganda's wildlife and heritage for future generations.

Wild Frontiers offer low impact tourism plus encourage their guests to participate in community experiences, sample local food and buy local arts and crafts. For a truly wild experience look no further than Lemala Wildwaters Lodge in Uganda - one of Africa's most unique lodges.

Only accessible by boat, the lodge is situated on Kalagala Island, midstream within the Victoria Nile River. Dramatically perched on huge granite rocks with awe-inspiring views and roaring rapids all around, a stay here is the perfect complement to a greater Ugandan or even Tanzanian safari.

This instagram-worthy lodge has just 10 stand-alone luxury suites (including 1 family suite) that are elevated, and nestled within the surrounding rainforest. Each offers incredible river views and are linked by raised wooden walkways, providing access to the main lodge. They feature locally made furniture, beautiful bathrooms with rain showers, and to cap it off, large private balconies with a freestanding bath overlooking the rapids.

Not to be outdone, the main lodge area consisting of a restaurant, bar and library, also boasts a sensational swimming pool that cantilevers out above the river. Expert chefs create sophisticated dishes that are served in the main area, however private dinners can also be organised in your suite or poolside.

Guests can do as much or as little as they choose during their stay. Activities at the lodge are largely based around the river and the nearby adventure town of Jinja, on the shores of Lake Victoria. White-water rafting, bungee jumping, kayaking and birdwatching are all popular, with Uganda home to more than 1000 bird species.

WHERE TO STAY?

The Wallow

Located in its own private concession in Victoria Falls National Park, The Wallow is an intimate 16-suite camp that overlooks the Masuwe River. The lodge has a light footprint on the land, using sustainable materials such as solar power and environmentally friendly decking. The main lodge boasts a beautiful swimming pool and a sunken deck with a fire pit that overlook the river below.



The Elephant Camp

Situated a stone's throw from sister camp The Wallow, The Elephant Camp has been rated as one of the country's most luxurious camps and boasts a view of the Zambezi Gorges. The Elephant Camp Main offers 12 luxury suites with personal plunge pools and indoor and outdoor showers. 


Old Drift Lodge

A JOURNEY LIKE NO OTHER - ROVOS RAIL






Their superb carriages have been painstakingly restored to their former glory. As soon as guests step onboard, they fall in

UNDERSTATED LUXURY

BY NATURAL SELECTION



With superb safari camps and lodges located in some of the best wildlife and wilderness areas, Natural Selection has southern Africa covered. Across Botswana's Okavango Delta and Kalahari Desert, as well as Namibia's wild landscapes, and with a beautiful beach lodge on South Africa's southwest cape, they offer a choice of understated accommodation.

Legendary Jack's Camp (pictured above) in the Kalahari has been setting the standard in the Makgadikgadi Pans National Park for decades with its elegant tented suites and iconic interiors. Newly rebuilt, the camp is now even more lavish with private ensuite plunge pools. It hasn't lost any of its charm, and still boasts the fascinating Natural History Museum, and the popular Persian Tea Tent. A highlight here is the desert-adapted wildlife, from black-maned Kalahari lions and aardwolves, to the population of habituated meerkats - some of whom are so friendly they often use guests as a lookout!

To the north, the Okavango Delta and surrounding private reserves offer a completely different ecosystem to explore. The waterways and islands are a haven for all manner of birdlife and wildlife. Here, there are several outstanding camps that each sit in their own private concession. Sophisticated and intimate Tuludi (pictured right) is set within a landscape of floodplains

and emerald forests. A perfect complement to the Kalahari, there are just 7 tree-house style suits.

Two new camps set to open in 2023/2024, North Island Okavango and Tawana, will take luxury and serenity to a new level. North Island is located on a private island, whilst Tawana is named in honour of Chief Tawana Moremi, and is situated in a prime location within the Moremi Game Reserve.



The reserve was first created in 1963, and has since been expanded twice, now protecting over 5,000 square kilometres of pristine wilderness. It was the current Chief Tawana's visionary father and grandmother who were instrumental in the creation of the reserve.






Often referred to as the “Paris of South America” due to its glorious boulevards, superb cafe culture, innovative dining and iconic tango and arts scene, Buenos Aires is the perfect place to start or end any South American adventure.

I’ve had the pleasure of visiting twice - including spending 3 nights here after a trip through Bolivia. The city also boasts beautiful neighbourhoods, fascinating museums, and of course, the famous Recoleta Cemetery (a must visit!) where several notable people are buried, including legendary singer Eva Perón.

A slow and relaxed cycling tour of the city is the perfect way to discover some of its hidden gems and beautiful parklands. Each suburb has its own flavour and highlights. The Sunday market in San

Telmo is a popular place to begin a day, whilst the street art, cheese and wine bars and the restaurants of Palermo can be explored in the afternoon and evening.

A highlight for me (and any steak or red wine lovers) was dining at Don Julio restaurant, which now sits at #14 in “The World’s 50 Best Restaurants”. The experience was superb, from enjoying a few glasses of champagne outside as we waited for a table, to the interior decor and finally the steak and wine itself.

Just 2 hours flight from Buenos Aires, Iguazu Falls on the Argentinean and Brazilian border combines well, for either a day trip or a short stay. Find out more on page 25.

DID YOU KNOW?

One of the planet’s most awe-inspiring waterfalls, the Iguazú Falls (or Iguacu in Brazil) straddle the Argentinean/Brazilian border and are simply an astonishing sight to behold. A short flight from both Buenos Aires and Rio de Janeiro, the falls have been historically important over the centuries. Tourists flock to experience the sheer scale of the cataracts, the thrills of white-water rafting, exploring the luxuriant jungle and uncovering the area’s fascinating history.

Legend of the Cataracts

According to Guaraní tradition the falls originated when a warrior named Caroba incurred the wrath of a forest god by escaping downriver in a canoe with a beautiful young girl, Naipí, whom the god desired. Infuriated the god caused the river to collapse creating the falls, over which Naipí fell and turned into a rock.

Tourism

Iguazú Falls attracts well over 1.3 million visitors every year. There are countless hotels on offer but only two are located in the national parks surrounding Iguazú Falls - the beautiful Gran Meliá Iguazú on the Argentinean side, and Belmond Hotel das Cataratas on the Brazilian side.

UNESCO History

Edmundo de Barros, a Brazilian army officer proposed Iguazú Falls become a national park back in 1897. Due to country boundaries, it wasn’t until 1984 that this became a reality, and Iguazú National Park was created on the Argentinean side, and Iguacu National Park two years later on the Brazilian side. Within these parks the rainforest delta surrounding the falls is home to over 2,000 species of plants.

European history

The first European born explorer to view Iguazú Falls was the Spanish Conquistador Álvar Núñez Cabeza de Vaca in 1541 after whom one of the falls on the Argentinean side is named.




variety of dining, performing arts, and other city attractions at your fingertips.

There are few places in the world more spectacular for bear viewing than Alaska’s Katmai National Park. The park is home to the world’s largest concentration of grizzly bears – approximately 2,200 – and the best place to see them is at Katmai Wilderness Lodge - a remote, but comfortable eco lodge on the shores of Kukak Bay.

Families of bears are often seen roaming the picturesque meadows and coastal flats right outside the lodge, which is already full for 2023. If you would like to go we urge you to book now for 2024. With a maximum of 12 guests at the lodge you are unlikely to see any other people in the area, making this an intimate and unique wilderness experience.

The lodge is managed by Perry and Angela Mollan who love welcoming visitors and sharing their knowledge of the flora and fauna. Perry is a fourth generation Alaskan and he and Angela have lived and worked in the park for many years. They even got married here. They and other experienced guides take guests on daily excursions by boat or on foot to look for bears. With 42 different mammal species in the park visitors may also see seals, sea otters, fox and possibly wolves and whales.




